# BE OUR EYES AND EARS

During the Coronavirus pandemic it has not been possible to meet physically residents at the door step or deliver paper copies of our community newsletter so Louis and Tom have been doing the next best thing by calling as many residents as possible on the phone and delivering Battenhall News by email instead of paper.

Tom said, "It's not as easy or justifiable for us to be out as much as we would like so we are appealing to local people to let us know what issues need dealing with on their street. We normally see things like potholes, blocked drains, street lights that aren't working as well as litter and fly tipping when we are out and about doing our job as community champions.

So we need you to let us know if you see these sorts of issues. If you let us know of things, please also give us location information (e.g. which house, street light number the issue is near) and it helps if you can send us photos of the problem."

## **DOMESTIC ABUSE**

Domestic abuse or violence is a crime and should be reported to the police - there are also other organisations who can offer you help and support. Both men and women can be victims of domestic abuse but statistics show clearly that women are more likely to experience abuse.
